


TOWN OF CABOT
ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF PARKING

The Selectmen of the Town of Cabot having determined that the Public Safety, Welfare and Convenience require an ordinance regulating parking on its Streets and Highways hereby adopts the following ordinance pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1752 et.seq. :


1. Between November 15 and April 15 no motor vehicles shall be parked on any street or highway within the Town of Cabot between the hours of 11:30 PM and 5:30 AM.
2. The selectmen may erect signs clearly designating zones where parking is restricted or where parking is prohibited. No person is authorized to park a motor vehicle in such zones contrary to instructions printed on such signs.
3. It shall be unlawful for any motor vehicle to be parked in whole or in part on any sidewalk within the town of Cabot or so as to obstruct pedestrian passage on the same. Further, it shall be unlawful for any motor vehicle to be parked upon the grassed area of the Cabot Town Common. The person(s) to whom such motor vehicle parked in violation of this ordinance is registered shall be subject to the penalty provisions provided hereafter.
4. No person shall utilize the streets or highways of the Town of Cabot for residential parking. "Residential parking" means the primary storage place for any motor vehicle ancillary to a residence.

A rebuttable presumption shall arise that this section was violated if a motor vehicle was parked on any street or highway within the town of Cabot for a period of eight hours or more than three times within any thirty-day period within 600 feet of the residence or domicile of such motor vehicle's owner or registrant.
5. All violations of this ordinance shall be civil in nature and shall be subject to a civil penalty of up to \$50.00 for a first offense and \$100.00 for a second and subsequent offense and prosecuted pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1974a.
6. Towing: Any motor vehicle parked in violation of sections 1, 2 or 3 of this ordinance and, where there are conspicuous signs forbidding the offense committed posted at or near the area affected, may be towed at the order of the town constable, second constable or any other law enforcement officer. Any person entitled to possession of such motor vehicle and wishing to redeem such the same, shall pay any and all towing and/or storage charges.


